


NOVEMBER NEWS

Staff Spotlight: Raenell Smith

Raenell Smith, Media Specialist at WHS and Chair-Elect of the Association of Indiana School Library Educators, has spent the last few months sharing her expertise at the national level, while still finding ways to innovate locally.

In October, Raenell represented Indiana school librarians at the American



Association of School Libraries National Conference in St. Louis. She delivered a presentation titled "Broken Builds Community: How a Book Repair Shop Serves Students and the Library," showcasing a program she developed with resource teacher Mary Zosbi. The project helps students earn work hours while repairing hundreds of library books, providing a hands-on experience that builds both skill and connection.

"It was incredible. Being a school librarian is something you do solo most of the time, so being in a crowd that was like me was so reaffirming," Smith said. She also collaborated with Tim Jones, the 2025 SLJ School Librarian of the Year, in an IdeaLab presentation on advocacy and networking for librarians, and co-presented with award-winning librarian Diane Rogers on demonstrating the value of school librarians through data and evaluation.

Smith is continuing her professional growth through the ALA Law for Librarians course, will become an L4L trainer in Indiana, and is preparing her first fully peer-reviewed academic article that is scheduled for publication in November 2026. She will also present in a national webinar and attend a December ALA leadership training on library advocacy.

"I love returning to school and hearing students ask about the work I've done," Smith commented. "They are just as invested in teachers' success as we are in theirs."

Through her programs and presentations, Smith embodies leadership in school librarianship, while simultaneously inspiring students, colleagues, and librarians from all over. We are so lucky to have her be a part of us.

Special Story: How Amazon Donations Support Our School Community

In the midst of this holiday season, as we celebrate giving and gratitude, we want to bring light to our ongoing partnership that brings crucial support to our families and staff. For the past two years, CPEF has received donations from local Amazon fulfillment centers, filled with food, clothing, toys, toiletries, school supplies, and more.

The partnership was first brought to the district by Jamie Jo Hampton, who helped establish the original arrangement. "We are so incredibly grateful; this has opened up avenues I could have never dreamed of," she remarked.

Each shipment is delivered to the "barn" an old gym now used for storage— where volunteers then come together to sort all the items. Once they are sorted, a free "store" is set up, where staff members can shop for themselves or for students who need extra help.

"It is probably my favorite program of the year," said Tracy Neer, who oversees the pickup, sorting, and shopping process. "It warms my heart."

The donations have been especially valuable to teachers during the holiday



season, when both classroom needs and personal expenses increase. "I love this experience because of all the goodies I can put into my classroom without paying for them," preschool teacher Amber Buller commented, who uses donated craft supplies, toys, and extra clothing for her students. Last year, she even used items from the program to give her students a chance to do "Christmas shopping" for their parents, making the holiday extra special for families in need.

Any leftover items are shared with local nonprofits, extending the spirit of giving beyond the school community.

Through this program, everybody benefits: staff, students, and families alike, making a difference in so many lives everyday.

Student Spotlight: Camrin Mccarty


