Staff Spotlight: Jamie Kidwell

Decade of Impact: Jamie Kidwell Receives CPEF Grant for the Second Time

Ten years ago, Jamie Kidwell was a 4th grade teacher at Clark Elementary with a strong desire to continue growing as an educator. After looping with her students from 3rd to 4th grade, Jamie was eager to find new ways to keep her learners engaged, motivated, and successful. That opportunity

The Ron Clark Academy, founded by two nationally recognized educators, is known for its dynamic teaching practices, highly engaged students, and exceptional academic outcomes. Jamie participated in an intensive two-day training that left her inspired and energized.

"I was able to attend a two day training that left me mesmerized and inspired. It was so fun to bring back some of the ideas back to my classroom and keep my students engaged, motivated, and successful as we navigated state testing and the final nine weeks," said Jamie.

Now, a decade later, Jamie's passion for student success continues in a new role. Currently serving as the Literacy Coach at Whiteland Elementary, she works closely with teachers through coaching cycles and MTSS meetings. Through this work, Jamie has identified a growing need for additional resources, knowledge, and instructional strategies that help students learn how to prepare themselves to learn.

This year, Jamie was awarded another grant from CPEF, marking a meaningful milestone in her professional journey. This new grant provides access to specialized coursework that will allow her to train staff on effective strategies to support learner readiness. Additionally, grant funds will be used to purchase classroom kits for select kindergarten and first-grade classrooms. These kits will include a variety of materials that students will learn to use to help improve focus and engagement in the classroom.

Adding to the significance of this moment is a full-circle connection. One of Jamie's students from her classroom ten years ago, Kylie McGovern, was present when Jamie received her second grant—this time serving as a CPEF Intern. The moment highlighted the lasting impact educators have on their students and the incredible continuity of learning and leadership within Clark Pleasant Community Schools.

Receiving a grant again, ten years after her first, reflects Jamie Kidwell's dedication to continuous growth and her commitment to supporting both students and staff. Her journey exemplifies the strength of investing in educators and the meaningful ripple effects that can span generations.

Honoring Jerry Lasiter Through Competition and Community

The Clark-Pleasant Community School Corporation continues to honor the legacy of Jerry Lasiter (WCHS Class of 1967) through the Jerry Lasiter Scholarship, which supports students as they continue their education after high school.

While the annual community pickleball tournament remains a cornerstone fundraiser—celebrating Jerry's love of the sport and his gift for bringing people together—the scholarship is also supported through a **staff-only volleyball tournament**. Held each winter, the event brings employees from across the district together for a night of friendly competition, fellowship, and purpose.

For staff member Bethany Guilfooy, who has coordinated the volleyball tournament for the past three years, the event is deeply personal.

"This tournament was created as a way to honor Jerry's legacy while bringing staff members together for a night of fellowship, fun, and connection—both within buildings and across the district," Guilfooy shared. "It's filled with laughter, friendly competition, and meaningful memories. Most importantly, it serves as a tribute to the lasting impact Jerry made



through his kindness, spirit, and love for the Whiteland Warriors."

The Jerry Lasiter Scholarship is awarded to Clark-Pleasant students who reflect Jerry's commitment to inclusion and service. Students may qualify if they plan to pursue a career in Special Education, had an Individualized Education Program (IEP), or have made a meaningful impact in their school or community.

Through events like the Staff Volleyball Tournament, Jerry's legacy lives on—bringing people together and opening doors for future Clark-Pleasant graduates.

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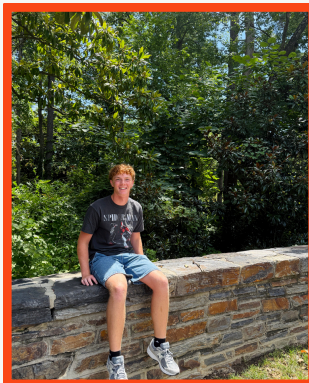
Welcome, Spring Intern: Cooper Adams

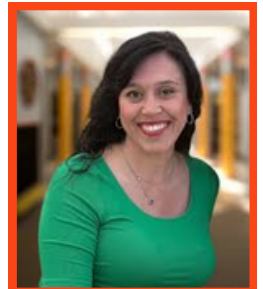
Cadey plans to major in **media with a focus on advertising** after high school and enjoys YLA for the leadership skills and real-world preparation it provides.
